**Tracy Bibelnieks** is an Associate Professor in the Swenson College of Science and Engineering at the University of Minnesota, Duluth. Tracy's research focuses on collaborating with local and State health, government and nonprofit agencies to use insights from public health and social determinants of health data to address health disparities in St. Louis County, Minnesota. Tracy also advises the UMD Data Science club that competes in state and national data science challenges on issues of social justice and the environment.

**Carrie Diaz Eaton** is an Associate Professor of Digital and Computational Studies at Bates College. Carrie is the Chair of the Committee for Minority Participation in Mathematics for the Mathematical Association of America. Carrie co-founded and is the Director of the QUBES Consortium. QUBES is a virtual platform ([qubeshub.org](http://qubeshub.org)) committed to accelerating STEM education reform which provides logistical, intellectual, and community support for innovative quantitative biology education projects and supporting instructors seeking open, accessible, equitable, and inclusive resources.
