
Instructions on How to Join ECOLOG-L

ECOLOG -L is an email listserv that ecologists use to post about jobs in Ecology. Jobs can be at the undergraduate, Masters, PhD, or Faculty level. Joining the listserve can be tricky. Here are some instructions.

NOTE: YOU DO NOT NEED AN ESA MEMBERSHIP TO SEE ECOLOG-L

The links can make it seem like you need a membership, but you don't. There is a way to access it without buying a membership.


- 1. Go to the ESA ECOLOG-L website here: https://www.esa.org/membership/ecolog/
- 2. Follow the "go here and create a web account" link to here: https://eservices.esa.org/
- 3. Select "Create a web account"
 - a. Fill out the information
 - b. Hit "save"



4. You should have a web profile now. Go to the "preferences tab"




5. In the preferences tab, select "include me in communities" and hit save




6. Then go to "online communities" and ECOLOG-L




7. That should redirect you to this welcome page, where you are already logged in.




8. Go to the "groups" menu and select "all groups"




9. Select "ECOLOG-L"



To see all the opportunities previously posted, select "Listserve email archive" on the left hand panel



11. Look at jobs!! It should look like this:



- 12. You can also set up the email setting to get information about the opportunities posted to ECOLOG-L in the following 3 ways. Go to "Email Settings" and then select the type of notification you want.
 - Individual email messages that arrive as the opportunities are submitted to ECOLOG-L
 - b. Digest which provides one email per day with the list of opportunities that were submitted in the past day.
 - c. Web Only means you do not receive any emails and you have to login to Ecolog-L to see the opportunities.
