- 3. "Stakeholder" terminology follow-up from the September call
  - a. Jody checked in with the DEI working group about the origins of the word stakeholder and how it is used. Here are resources shared by the DEI group
  - b. Here are key points from the DEI group resources
  - c. Alternative terms
    - i. Rightsholders, partners, interested parties, affected parties, interested groups, affected groups, non-academic partners, relevant parties,
    - ii. rights holder, actant and potential beneficiaries, those in the circle, those who do/should care, potentially interested parties, shareholder, investor, local resident.
      - partner, interested or potentially interested party came up multiple times
    - iii. Stakeholders obscures rightsholder don't lump in rightsholders and non-rightholders. E.g., Indigenous groups are distinct rightsholders
    - iv. Interested parties is there a legal framework for this term?
    - v. End users were not a term that came up in the documentation, but is a term that is often used with ecological forecasting
      - Example of a specific role
      - End user can be a special case where they are involved early on and use the product
    - vi. How to be thoughtful about language and thinking about who you are working with
