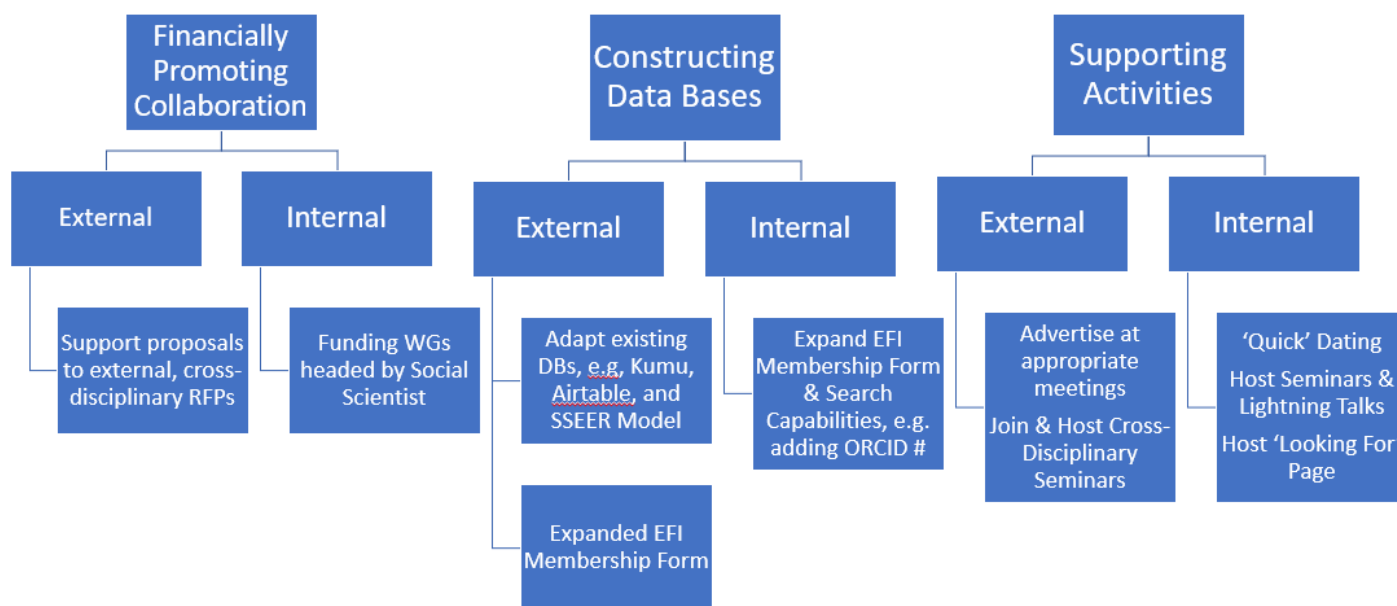

- b. Social Science & Ecological Forecasting Project RFP
 - i. Request to the EFI Steering Committee to use EFI funds to support 4 or 5 grants (\$1,250 or \$1,000, respectively) that encourage groups, led by public health or social scientists, to prepare to submit proposals related to ecological forecasting
 - ii. Includes draft text of: Project Description, FAQs, and Application Form
 - iii. Still needs Evaluation Criteria for how the organizing committee would determine which groups would get funded
 - Kira has been on review panels and can share resources
 - iv. Looking for asynchronous feedback from the group over the next 2 weeks so Chris and Jody can present this to the EFI Steering Committee on the Nov 30 call
 - v. Do we see this as rolling as funds are available or on a specific timeline that is connected to specific proposal deadlines

- vi. What can people do with the funds?
 - Can't do a lot with \$1000. Could possibly fund a week of a postdoc to do something a bit risky
 - Could there be 2 that are \$2500
 - It is more of a token of appreciation
 - Funds are direct to the PI of the proposal
 - Experiment for the first time
 - Acknowledge that the ideation process takes time and effort and we want to provide tangible benefit to do this even if you don't get funded on the backend
 - Maybe don't even ask for a budget. Be clear that it will be a direct payment to the applicant
 - Funds can be used for example "catering for get together, travel expenses, personnel support"
- vii. Is it possible to apply and then funds could be contributed to someone else's work?
 - Sure. That seems like an option.
- viii. Kira, Ayanna willing to look over materials (Ayanna is defending in 3 weeks!! So we want her to focus on that). But may not have time in the next few weeks, so may need to push it
- ix. Try to get it to the SC by the Nov 30 call with high level
- x. ESSIC/UMD (Michael and Chris' home institution) - have Affinity groups which have similar yearly budget. Could be a good example to share with the Steering Committee to show how other groups have developed engagement

2. Tutorial ideas and next steps

- a. Follow up with John about the water quality example he pulled together on pg 19 of the Google Slides
 - i. Supportive relationships between businesses and academia
 - ii. Another example from MA - can a forecasting model cut down on amount of time the equipment can be used so would there be less mechanical stress on the equipment
 - Could we have a section proposing a forecasting model for MA and go through the 5Ws and the How and Would a forecasting model be useful in this situation
 - iii. Could have a section with concrete examples.
 - iv. Or could have a section that shows how you could go through the process
- b. Spend time co-working to go through the slide material and discuss next steps
- c. Overview of Big Picture Ideas:
 - i. Series of short YouTube videos (5-10 minutes)
 - ii. Topic: Who, what, when, where, why, and how for partner/user/interested parties engagement and examples from the EFI community
- d. Google Slides

- i. How will slides translation into a video?
 - Need to take the materials in the slides and transition to creating materials for videos
 - ii. People have their own personal examples. If they are leading a video, then can bring their examples
 - iii. Next call - discuss how to move forward - who is going to take charge of different sections?
 - iv. End of the video - summarize the points we want to get across using the personal experiences
 - v. Do we have a short list of people who can lead the videos
 - vi. Could do an interview format - like having specific examples on the front end and then have a learning about discussion on the back end.
 - Would need someone in the group to take over the host role
 - Kira is happy to help interviewing
 - Put names in the hat for who in the EFI community to connect with
 - vii. Use the comment area on YouTube for people to share their experiences. Collecting data in stories
- e. Google folder with the slides and notes about the tutorial from previous calls
3. Materials from Vicky Boulton (European Chapter Co-Chair)
- a. On the October European Chapter seminar, Vicky presented her interdisciplinary work related to three topics: elephant ecology and conservation driven by climatic variability, forecasting climatic variables at decision-relevant timescales with a focus on soil moisture, and translating forecasts into action

 - ii. Jody followed up with Vicky since her work aligns nicely with the Translation working group. Vicky is going on maternity leave in December for a year, but when she gets back, Jody thinks it would be great to have her connect with the group to share what she is working on

 - vii. And she wonders if the working group is looking at co-production approaches? She says "Co-production of climate services is all the rage at the moment (and rightly so), and I've seen it creeping into the ecology literature too."

- Jody let her know that the group is thinking about co-production and shared the co-production series we hosted in 2021

 - a. Compiling list of funding opportunities for cross-disciplinary work or work requiring end users or stakeholders.
