

## Agenda

- 1. Who, what, when, where, why, and how for partner/user/interested parties engagement and examples from the EFI community Tutorial ideas

      - Have first 3 people to reach out and who is going to reach out

        - These will be the people to practice with (and officially use)
      - Ask for the group Google sheet for tracking people to reach out to
        - Please add emails and name of the project
    - ii. What do we think about timing?
      - Get all the interviews done, then do for example, the Who video that is interspersed with interview input
      - But also have the whole narrative available
      - We can see how it goes can release the whole narrative first or interspersed
      - We don't have a deadline and no one is expecting these to go out so let's do the best we can but not feel pressured to mee a specific deadline.
- 2. RFP for creating connections with social scientists update
  - a. The application form is not linked yet on the webpage yet but it is ready to go and the webpage is not added anywhere visible on the EFI webpage yet
  - b. Jody is looking for a wordpress app to make the FAQ section be accordion style so people click on a question and a text box drops down with the information
  - c. Payment updates
    - i. Provide 2 payments of \$500 this is what SSEER did for their seed grants to spread the funds out across more people?
    - ii. We have to invoice payments for BU, so we need to pay after work is done and a deliverable is provided
    - iii. What do people think about options to send funds at 2 time periods
      - 6 months \$500 (interim report) or \$1000 (full report and project is done)

- 1 year final report additional \$500 for those that were paid after 6 months or \$1000 if no funds were sent at 6 months
- Have the application be the deliverable to be able to invoice?
- Or have a deliverable be a ppt slide that describes the project. Or provide a conceptual figure to go on the website
- The potential to split in two was an option for people to get paid before a full year so we could get funds out sooner
- Keep the payment to a single person the PI, the social scientist.
  In description can say the funds can be used for whatever you want including sharing with other people
- Double check with Lauren/Mike about having the conceptual figure allowing for the payment to go out earlier.
- d. Timeline
  - i. Had planned for applications by May 15 with decision by June 1. What if we pushed it to applications by July 1, with decisions by July 15?
  - ii. Are there social science meetings coming up this spring or summer?
    - Behavior Science in June
    - Small workshop
    - Big meetings in Fall or February
  - iii. Keep in mind ideas of having a few check in with the groups over the year to remind them that they are
  - iv. Due mid-August. Respond by Sept 15.
    - Jody looked at the calendar. Let's respond by September 16 (Monday)
    - Ask for submissions by August 26 (Monday)
- e. Advertising discussed on March call
  - i. Jody and Alexis to work together to record short overview to go out with advertising
  - ii. Share on LinkedIn, Twitter,
  - iii. Kira can share with Conservation Social Science (ConSoSci partnership)

- f. Application updates:
  - i. Think about in the application to include a question that defines social science as someone who has a degree and/or publish in social science
  - ii. Add a question of where they heard of the announcement

- g. In the announcement link to the EFI page if you are looking for collaborators. This is a way to reach out for potential collaborators.
- h. Your membership in EFI has no bearing on whether you can apply to the grant put in the FAQ. Do I have to be an EFI member? No. But we would love for you to join and currently, there is no fee to become a member.
- 3. 2-page societal impacts recommendations document from the Unconference
  - a. During today's call we briefly shared the impetus and overview this document
  - b. It was a project developed during the EFI 2023 Unconference meeting in Boulder led by Alexis, Ayanna, Jessica Burnett, and Rebecca Finger-Higgens
  - c. Initially it was created to share with the Steering Committee to provide suggestions on how to consider societal impact across EFI activities
  - d. The Steering Committee discussed it on their January and February calls and then there was a follow-up call with the project group all of which generated ideas for future activities, some of which overlaps with the Translation working group
  - e. Next call Alexis will talk about the <u>2-pager</u>
- <u>2021 Ecosphere paper</u> Alexis shared for the RFP that connects nicely with this project. Title: Bridging the divide between ecological forecasts and environmental decision making
  - a. Could come back to this paper for discussion on a later call. Could go over the 10 guidelines
